The main entry of hall will be kept unlocked. The hall will remain set up as a worship area throughout this time. The stage light where sanctuary is situated will remain on. (You may turn on more lights but always leave the sanctuary area light on when you leave and shut off the rest). Votive candles have been brought over and placed along south wall. Please be respectful of our temporary worship space. The PSR children are being instructed how to be respectful of the area. At times when hall will be needed for a different purpose, the Blessed Sacrament will be removed to tabernacle in the rectory (as we do when a visitation is held in the church).
