The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council proposed to the universal Church that the ministry of the deacon came from the Apostles and, as such, should be restored as a permanent order in the Church. *Lumen Gentium* declared: **"The diaconate can in the future be restored as a proper and permanent rank of the hierarchy."** (LG 29)

This year, deacons and deacon candidates, their wives, bishops and priests will be gathering in New Orleans July 22-26th to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the institution of the permanent diaconate in the United States.

Formally restored by Pope Paul VI in 1967, the permanent diaconate has grown steadily ever since. On June 18, 1967, Pope Paul VI issued the apostolic letter **Sacrum Diaconatus Ordinem** which re-established the permanent diaconate for the Latin Church. Less than a year later, in May of 1968, the Catholic bishops of the United States petitioned the Holy See for permission to restore the diaconate. The Apostolic Delegate informed the bishops on August 30, 1968 that Pope Paul VI had agreed to their request; the National Conference of Catholic Bishops created a standing committee on the diaconate in November 1968.

Deacons were once again assigned to the traditional ministries of administering baptism, witnessing marriages, bringing viaticum to the dying, officiating at funerals proclaiming Sacred Scriptures, being Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and exhorting and instructing the people. However, charitable works of service are at the heart of the diaconate ministry. *Diakonia*, the Greek word from which the term "diaconate" was derived, means "service." Deacons receive Holy Orders and serve in the *Persona of Christ the Servant*. In fact, on their journey to the priesthood, priests receive the same Holy Orders as deacons but are called transitional deacons since they will move beyond the diaconate to the priesthood. Deacons take a promise of obedience to the bishop and work directly for him; often deacons are assigned to serve in parishes as well as in other areas of community service. Upon the death of a spouse deacons cannot remarry and must remain celibate (with rare exceptions such as having small children at home), and they do not receive a salary from the parish or diocese. Bishop McKnight addresses the reinstatement, history and direction of the diaconate in his newly published book, **"Understanding the Diaconate: Historical, Theological and Sociological Foundations."**

More than 17,000 permanent deacons are serving in full-time ministry in the United States today—more than in any other country and nearly half of the worldwide total of 36,000 active deacons. Last year we celebrated the 40th anniversary of the institution of the permanent diaconate in the Diocese of Jefferson City. The diocese currently has 62 active deacons—5 of whom serve outside the diocese. There are also numerous deacons who have retired but continue to serve the diocese in some capacity. 150 men have been ordained for the Diocese of Jefferson since the first ordinations in 1977.

The Diocese of Jefferson City will be well-represented at the celebration in New Orleans with 40 deacons, deacon candidates and their wives attending. Bishop McKnight is one of the scheduled keynote speakers, and Deacon Frances Butel will be one of the workshop presenters.
